Invited talks are 40 minutes total, including speaking and Q&A.

Chairs will strictly enforce the total time allotted to each speaker. Chairs will also follow the order of presentations listed in the program. Transition time between talks (e.g., setting up slides) should happen during the Q&A for the previous talk. To allow for attendees switching among parallel sessions, talks should not begin before their scheduled time, even if the previous talk ended early. No introductions are necessary beyond the speaker's name and talk title.
